He was born in {Anchiano} Italy 15th April 1452, he died 2nd May 1519. His greatest achievements were : an army tank 400 years before it became a reality.

A mechanical robot known as Leonardo's robot and he conceptualized the parachute glider, helicopter and landing gear. He drew the Vitruvian man and worked out how our measurements are proportionate. He inspires us by his incredible, vibrant art work and his amazing engineering.

The UK is made up of ...

- Four countries: England; Scotland; Northern Ireland and Wales
- Each Country has a Capital City (London; Edinburgh; Belfast and Cardiff)
- There are 48 counties in the UK, all are very different and have different landmarks and features.

Hills and mountains

- We researched and made bar charts to show the heights of different mountains in the UK.
- Do you know what a Topographical map is?
- Do you know what the difference is between a mountain and a hill?
- The tallest mountain in the UK (Scotland) is Ben Nevis with the elevation of 1344 metres
- The smallest mountain in England is Sleive Donard with the elevation of 850 metres.

- A mountain is formed by the tectonic plates crashing together or folding over each other. A hill is a naturally formed elevation of the earths surface.

Scotland

- Scotland above the north of England. The capital of Scotland is Edinburgh and the largest city is Glasgow.
- Edinburgh is the first in the world to have its own fire brigade.
- Also Scotland has approximately 790 islands.

England

- The capital city of England is London, which is also the biggest city. The second biggest city is Birmingham.
- The British Isles (the UK) became inhabited more than 800,000 years ago.
- The population now is nearly 56 million.

Northern Ireland

- Northern Ireland is the smallest country in the UK
- The capital city is Belfast
- N. Ireland is a part of the UK but it makes it's own laws. The Parliament buildings of the N. Ireland are called Stormont.



Wales

- Wales is a country in the southwest of the UK known for its coastline, mountains and national parks.
- Cardiff, the capital, is a refined coastal city with a medieval castle.
- Population: just over 3 million
