

Behaviour policy: coronavirus addendum

Foulsham Primary School



September 2020

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1. Scope

This addendum applies until further notice.

It sets out changes and exceptions to our normal behaviour policy. Pupils, parents and staff should continue to follow our normal behaviour policy with respect to anything not covered in this addendum.

We may need to amend or add to this addendum as circumstances or official guidance changes. We will communicate any changes to staff, parents and pupils.

2. Expectations for pupils in school

2.1 New rules

When pupils are in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below (in addition to our usual school rules) to keep themselves and the rest of the school community safe.

Staff will be familiar with these rules and make sure they are followed consistently.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure that their children follow the new procedures that have been put in place. Parents should contact Mrs Lound or Mrs Bourner if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them and support them to integrate back into school life.

At Foulsham Primary School we behave in a way to keep each other safe we:

- Tell an adult if we feel unwell.
- Give each other space.
- Wash our hands often particularly when we arrive at school, before and after eating, after using the toilet, after break time, before using the outside climbing equipment.
- Use tissues to: 'Catch it; Bin it; Kill it.'
- Cough into our elbow.
- Don't use loud voices inside the school building.



CATCH IT

Germs spread easily. Always carry tissues and use them to catch your cough or sneeze.



BIN IT

Germs can live for several hours on tissues. Dispose of your tissue as soon as possible.



KILL IT

Hands can transfer germs to every surface you touch. Clean your hands as soon as you can.



Hand-washing technique with soap and water



1 Wet hands with water




2 Apply enough soap to cover all hand surfaces




3 Rub hands palm to palm




4 Rub back of each hand with palm of other hand with fingers interlaced



5 Rub palm to palm with fingers interlaced



6 Rub with back of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlocked



7 Rub each thumb clasped in opposite hand using a rotational movement



8 Rub tips of fingers in opposite palm in a circular motion

2.2 Rewards and consequences for following rules

To help encourage pupils to follow the above rules, we will use our usual rewards and consequences. If a child accidentally breaks a rule they will be gently reminded. If a child purposefully chooses to break a rule, we will use our usual consequences; however, as this choice would put other people in danger we will contact parents/carers if such an incident occurs.

2.3 Changed rules

Whilst we were partially open expectations for attendance and uniform were relaxed following Government guidelines; however, we will revert to our usual expectations for both uniform and attendance from September:

- Expectations for attendance – the [latest government guidance](#) says attendance will be mandatory from September. If your child is unable to attend school, it is vital that you contact the school office by 9:15am to inform us of the reason for your child's absence.
- Expectations for uniform –it is expected that children will wear school uniform including school shoes. Children must also have a PE kit in school including trainers which is brought into school on a Monday.

3. Expectations for pupils at home

3.1 Remote learning rules

If pupils are not in school due to having to self-isolate or for another authorised reason, but are well, we expect them to complete all home learning tasks which will be set on Seesaw.

4. Monitoring arrangements

We will review this policy as guidance from the local authority or Department for Education is updated, and as a minimum each month, by Mrs Lound and Mrs Bourner. At every review, it will be approved by the full governing board.
